Islamic Relief Malaysia (IRM) together with Islamic Relief Worldwide (IRW) have co-organised Asia Regional Retreat 2018 at Bangi last January (14-19 January). The programme was conducted to achieve every goal and objective set out in Asia Regional Strategy 2017 - 2021. Besides, it was planned to review business plan and identify resources for the region.

Throughout the programme, participants will have better understanding on regional strategy as well as regional business plan. On top of that, Islamic Relief from other regions are expected to be able to develop their respective country strategies and business plans.

Every participant also had a chance to do a presentation on their strategy and plans for their future campaigns. The countries include Afghanistan, Bangladesh, China, India, Indonesia, Myanmar, Nepal, Pakistan, Philippines, and Sri Lanka. On a side note, they were also brought to visit Rohingya Integrated School of Excellence (RISE).

IRM sees education as an important element in life as a preparation for the future apart from basic needs such as foods and shelters. Through education, many programmes have been conducted such as multimedia skills teachings, free tuition classes, and motivational programmes.

Islamic Relief Malaysia (IRM) conducted a programme namely Cheer to School in Kelantan on January 20th 2018. It is an annual programme planned by IRM in offering school assistance to those in need.

Besides, the programme is seen as an education support for the children so that they will be more motivated to study while offloading the burden held by their parents.

Cheer to School was conducted at two locations in Kelantan; Rantau Panjang and Tumpat.

A total number of 42 beneficiaries were given school aids such as school uniform, bag, school shoes, stationeries, socks, scarf, and belt.

All aids are meant to be given to those effected from flood who had not been receiving any help from any humanitarian organisation.









A DOOR OF RAHMAT FOR EVERYONE

Islamic Relief Malaysia (IRM) is calling everyone to make donations while helping the people in need through Charity Shoppe which has been operating five years ago.

According to Chief Executive Officer IRM, Zairulshahfuddin Zainal Abidin, the shop is seen as a door of mercy for every customer who steps into the shop to contribute for the beneficiaries.

Charity Shoppe is also reflected as a hub for acquaintanceship between newcomers and the staff without considering their ethnicities and religions to understand IRM more in depth.

The idea is in line with the concept of IRM that fully practices 'open door' for every customer who visits the shop.

After five years operation, Zairulshahfuddin believes that Malaysians really have soft spot in their heart to offer help in the form of donation as the shop has been receiving many items every single day.

Charity Shoppe is not just a usual shop outside where the customers are only there to buy something but also a centre for those interested to join as a volunteer or donor in the future.

Zairulshahfuddin also extends his thankfulness towards Datin Norelan Ismail who was the previous manager for Charity Shoppe for the success she brought up to date.

As of now, Charity Shoppe accepts a variety of items including apparels, books, decorations, and the rarest item ever received is gold-plated stamp authenticated by Pos Malaysia.

IRM SHARING JOY WITH THE DISABLED

In conjunction with Chinese New Year Celebration, around 300 beneficiaries at the Handicapped and Mentally Disabled Children Association (HMDCA), Kulai received basic items through Program Interaksi Bersama Orang Kelainan Upaya (OKU) organised by Islamic Relief Malaysia (IRM) on Feb 12, 2018.

The event was conducted to establish a peaceful racial harmony in a community consisting of various different skin colors which can foster a better relationship between IRM volunteers and HMDCA occupants.

Most of the beneficiaries come from different ethnic groups that include Chinese, Indian, and Malay which can be sub-clustered to a group of orphans, disabled, and senior citizens.

Majority of them have lost contacted with their relatives and most cases come from the Department of Social Welfare or were sent by their own families without any fees charged for further care.

The programme does not only emphasise on the donations given to the beneficiaries but IRM volunteers held a few activities with them and decorated their centres as a way to create joy for the Chinese New Year 2018 festivity even without family members celebrating together.

IRM also had the same event for Chinese New Year 2018 organised concurrently, Perak OKU Association, Sungai Siput and Si Putih OKU Welfare Centre, Seremban, Negeri Sembilan respectively.

The programme that was held on Feb 28, 2018 drives IRM into a more positive direction when participants from various backgrounds such as doctor, lecturer, and athlete also support the effort of IRM in offering aids for the less fortunate.

It is also seen as a move by IRM to foster a better relationship with the volunteers in a friendlier way as the number of registered volunteers now exceeds 3.000 members.

The main aim of the programme is to equip all new members with useful skills through practical learnings such as role-play and presentation.

IRM also imparted some experiences in helping the beneficiaries in Somalia to the volunteers as a way for them to feel empathised of the less fortunate.

For information, VIC was introduced in 2013 as an approach for new volunteers to thrive together with IRM for humanitarian works.

IRM PORTRAYS GLOBAL HUMANITARIAN ISSUES

Islamic Relief Malaysia (IRM) encourages everyone to be concerned on the global humanitarian issues through #SalamRamadan 1439H Campaign that lasts until mid-June.

The campaign aims to provide extensive exposure about Ramadan Campaign while raising public awareness on the continuous humanitarian issues across the globe.

Through this campaign, we are targeting to accumulate RM10 million funds to be allocated for various sectors including health, food, education, water, sanitation and hygiene, shelters, disabled, and orphans.

This year, IRM will distribute 6,000 Ramadan food packs across the nation as well as 3,540 food packs in more than 30 countries.

#SalamRamadan Campaign will be impactful for 30,000 beneficiaries locally and 3.4 million beneficiaries nationwide through a variety of projects namely Ramadan food pack, mySedekah, local project, international project, emergency appeal, Wagaf, and Al-Yateem.

Malaysians are inborn with high sympathy values which can be a major contribution to every mission implemented by IRM in an effort to alleviate humanitarian issues occurring across the world.

During the event, a flash mob performed by a group of IRM volunteers has successfully captured the attention of public through the portrayal of different actions such as earthquake, drought, poverty, and education. The event also gained a full support from MyTown and Santai Penyet.
