LEBANON NEEDS IMMEDIATE HUMANITARIAN ASSISTANCE

Bangi – The non-governmental organization (NGO), Islamic Relief Malaysia has set an initial target of RM300,000 to help Lebanese people affected by the warehouse explosion in Beirut Port last Tuesday.

The funds will be raised within a month through Dariku Untukmu... Selamatkan Mereka! LEBANON campaign that has launched recently.

Chief Executive Officer of Islamic Relief Malaysia, Zairulshahfuddin Zainal Abidin, said Islamic Relief is currently in a state of readiness and working at its best to help the people of Lebanon.

“A few hours after the explosion, Islamic Relief Lebanon was already on the ground to monitor the situation closely in exploring the main assistance needed.

“Until now, the search and rescue (SAR) operation is still being continued by various parties. More than 154 people were reported dead meanwhile more than 5000 people were injured and hundreds more have yet to be found.

“Previously, Lebanon encountered crises from various angles. The Covid-19 cases are soaring at an alarming rate and now, an explosion measuring 4.5 on the Richter scale plunging Lebanon deeper into crisis. The hospital can no longer accommodate the growing number of patients,” said Zairulshahfuddin.

Therefore, Zairulshahfuddin call for the public to help those affected in Lebanon by donating via Islamic Relief Malaysia.

Worst Tragedy

Meanwhile, the Country Director of Islamic Relief Lebanon, Nidal Ali, said he is still shocked by the unexpected incident.

“All of us in Beirut is still shocked after the recent explosion. I was at home by the time the glass door of our house balcony shattered. At first, we thought it was an earthquake.

“This is another tragedy for this country which is already stands on brink of collapse. In recent decades, the economic crisis has reached its worst where almost half of the population lives below the poverty line while another 35% are unemployed. Many people of Lebanon are refugees who have been suffering for ages. Now, they find it increasingly difficult to survive even to provide basic food supplies.

“In October last year, we had to stop all long-term programs and prioritize food pack distribution due to the current economic crisis that has made humanitarian issues increasingly critical.

“This all happened before the rife of coronavirus pandemic around the world and Lebanon experienced a surge in cases in recent weeks that filled health centres and hospitals.

“Islamic Relief has already started its response. We are currently looking to provide drinking water and food for people who have lost their homes. In a few days, we will also start helping to clear the streets full of debris caused by the blast, and providing people who are currently unemployed with cash to help out. In the longer-term, we will need to continue providing food parcels as the seaport has been destroyed, which means food imports will be significantly reduced to a country that is already on its knees,” explains Nidal.
